KATHERINE CONTAMINATION CLASS ACTION - UPDATE

Summary

 IMF announces that funding of the Katherine contamination class action is now unconditional.

Katherine Contamination Class Action

IMF Bentham Limited (**IMF**) refers to its previous announcement of 30 October 2017 stating that IMF proposed to fund on a conditional basis a class action against the Commonwealth of Australia (Department of Defence) (**DoD**) relating to the contamination alleged to have been caused by the DOD's use of aqueous film forming foam at the Tindal RAAF Base in the Northern Territory (**Katherine Class Action**).

IMF announces that the funding of the Katherine Class Action, financed through its Rest of the World Funds (Fund 2 and Fund 3), is now unconditional.

Property owners and businesses affected by the contamination are potentially eligible to participate. IMF is continuing to take registrations from persons interested in participating in the Katherine Class Action.

The Katherine Class Action is being conducted by Shine Lawyers.
